Our History

Founded in 2016 by Brisbane-based artists Lewellyn Millhouse and Caity Reynolds, Outer Space has grown from an artist-run initiative to an emerging contemporary arts space. Outer Space moved from West End to the Judith Wright Arts Centre in Fortitude Valley, Meanjin in April 2021. In 2020, Outer Space obtained Restart Investment to Sustain and Expand (RISE) funding for the launch of a regional public art project across billboards, window gallery exhibitions and online platforms. Outer Space is also the recipient of Arts Queensland Organisations Fund 2022-2025, a crucial investment which will support the evolution of Outer Space as a dynamic and inclusive contemporary arts space in Meanjin.

Outer Space is a not-for-profit Contemporary Arts organisation based in Meanjin (Brisbane). We collaborate with artists and artsworkers to develop, make, and present critically engaged creative practice in a supportive professional environment. Our exhibitions, events, and programs welcome those involved in, and curious about the arts. Outer Space is committed to fostering a sustainable creative community in Meanjin that engages local, regional, national and global contexts.

Outer Space is dedicated to careers by connecting people with opportunities and creating a vibrant platform for open and constructive dialogues with art. We aspire to grow and diversify our audiences through compelling and challenging programs, a heightened digital presence and strong collaborative partnerships. We advocate for and support diverse artists and arts workers by guaranteeing fees, commissioning writing and documenting each exhibition to our distinct industry standard.

As we move into 2023 and beyond, Outer Space will continue to be an exhibition and studio space that encourages the professional development of emerging, early and mid-career artists through our spaces at the Judith Wright Arts Centre, and our studios on Wickham Street, Fortitude Valley. With the federal government's RISE funding, we have partnered with regional Queensland contemporary arts venues, and have worked with other regional venues to support the delivery of our SUPERCUT program that celebrates the flourishing contemporary arts across Queensland.

Our People

Outer Space has a committed community of people as its backbone. Hamish Sawyer completed his term in leading the organisation in July 2022. Hamish is succeeded by Georgia Hayward in the role of General Manager. Our team expanded in October 2022, with Keemon Williams joining the team as the Exhibitions Assistant along with Tess Bakharia as the Promotions Officer. The Management Committee (the Board) includes artists and representatives from the Brisbane arts sector, education and professional industries.

Governance

Outer Space Chair's Report 2022

Earlier in the year I saw a listing in *The Saturday Paper*, in their *what's on cultural* events around Australia, for an exhibition at Outer Space. Listed with large survey shows, musicals, and performances from major venues around Australia, it signalled the national importance that our organisation has in the support and presentation of contemporary art.

Seven years on from the humble beginnings of presenting exhibitions in the back of a small storehouse in Woolloongabba, Outer Space has grown to support stable funding from the primary funder Arts Queensland to provide a reliable platform for early career artists, artsworkers and audiences. The foundational work of Llewellyn Millhouse and Caity Reynolds has been progressed by successive groups of community-minded artists, curators, accountants, academics, and professionals that have volunteered their time to support the organisation through the Management Committee / Board. Working on these foundations, the Board of 2022 has sought to:

- Improve financial oversight of operations and book-keeping.
- Update governance and human resource procedures to reflect changes in the organisation.
- Apply for Deductible Gift Recipient status.
- Develop employment opportunities within the organisation to improve the services and support that we can offer the community.
- Advocate for longer lease terms for exhibition and administration spaces with Arts Queensland, including a pitch for a new venue opportunity to allow for greater service provision of existing activities.

It is largely unglamorous stuff, not the kind of thing anyone cares to think about when you're enjoying an exhibition opening. Which is good. The intent is for the board to keep these sorts of activities in the background, albeit available for scrutiny and input, while we more prominently advocate for:

excellence in the artworks exhibited, critical writing & discussions, professional development programs, social events that celebrate the endeavours of the art community, and opportunities to grow the careers of artists and artsworkers.

A depth of gratitude is given to board members that completed their term in 2022, including: Alexandra Poiner, Libby Davis, Holly Hart, Robert Hughes, Sarah Werkmeister, and Gabrielle White.

We thank Hamish Sawyer for his work with the organisation, particularly with his skill in working with artists for the presentation of their work, and we are grateful for the industrious and enthusiastic work of Georgia Hayward in the role of General Manager from the second half of the year.

Outer Space General Manager's Report 2022

In July 2022, I commenced the role of General Manager, taking over from Hamish Sawyer who led Outer Space through a period of transition and continued to expand the organisations programming. I would like to extend my sincere thanks to Hamish and the 2022 Board for their leadership and visioning that has guided the organisation over the past year. I would also like to extend my deepest gratitude to Kirralee Robinson, Alice Rezende, Olivia Trenorden and Lauren Spriggs for sharing your talents, creativity and wisdom with Outer Space across our exhibitions and public programming in 2022.

Outer Space delivered yet another year of dynamic arts programming in 2022. Our SUPERCUT program supported the development and delivery of new works from forty-three emerging, early and mid-career practitioners through the regional art activation project SUPERCUT. Supported by the Federal Government's RISE (Restart Investment to Sustain and Expand) COVID recovery fund and presented in partnership with Artspace Mackay and NorthSite Contemporary Arts, Cairns, the project focused on creating more opportunities and networks with regional artists, arts workers and communities throughout Queensland. With the support of Judith Wright Arts Centre Management team and funding from Arts Queensland, Australia Council for the Arts, Creative Partnerships Australia and the Brisbane City Council, Outer Space was able to present a series of ambitious exhibitions in the JWAC Gallery space and outward-facing exhibitions on the building's facades and Berwick St Windows, extending our program into highly visible public locations.

To assist with the delivery of our programming, we welcomed Keemon Williams into the role of Exhibitions Assistant and Tess Bakharia as our new Promotions Officer in November. The addition of these roles to our staffing structure has supported a necessary capacity growth to 2FTE. Both Tess and Keemon have taken to their roles with passion and ability taking Outer Space from strength to strength.


In line with the 2021-2025 Strategic Plan, Outer Space met the requirement for 72.2% of the 2022 KPIs. We have met all goals relating to Compelling and Challenging Programming and Support and Advocacy. However, we have only met 33.3% of our Growing our Audience KPIs, 50% of our Financial Stability KPIs and 50% of our Transparent and Responsible Governance KPIs.

With our increased staff capacity and refined governance structuring, I am confident we will deliver on our outstanding KPIs next year. Our operational areas of focus moving into 2023 are:

- Ensuring diversity of revenue streams
- Expanding our partnerships and marketing strategy
- Board Diversity and Succession Planning

I extend my sincerest thanks to the Outer Space Board for their continued support as we navigated the various changing landscapes in 2022, and their continued commitment to building a strong foundation for the organisation's ongoing success. I am delighted to continue working with my colleagues, Keemon and Tess, to deliver yet another exciting year for Outer Space in 2023.

Activities & Achievements

Throughout our 2022, we continued to expand our digital and gallery-based public programs and public art opportunities, alongside our core activities maintained from 2021.

- 3 regional engagement workshops







Overview of Artists Engaged




Program Engagement Overview


